It Is the Longest Constitution in the World

117,369 words make it the longest Constitution in the world. The Constitution wasn't typed or printed, both Hindi and English versions were handwritten.

The Constitution was written in calligraphy by Prem Behari Narain Raizada (Saxena) and Chhattisgarh's Dr Ghanshyam Gupta translated it into Hindi.

The type of pens used-

The English Calligraphy was written with no. 303 pen and Hindi calligraphy was written with Hindoo dip-pen nib from Birmingham.

It took almost 3 years to complete.

To be precise, it took 2 years, 11 months and 18 days to come up with the final draft of the Indian Constitution.

Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar is the father of the Indian Constitution. Appointed as the Chairman of the Drafting Committee of the Constituent Assembly, he was entrusted with the responsibility of preparing the Constitution. Being a well-known politician, jurist and a Dalit icon, he raised voice against injustice and discrimination faced by his community. He was the first Union Minister of Law and Justice in the Nehru Government and played a pivotal role as the key architect of the Constitution of India.

ISRO - A RISING STAR

Listening to India's achievements is always exhilarating. Did you know, India is the only country to have launched a whopping number of satellites in one go! I dug deeper into this point and found many engrossing facts that astounded me to the core.

After the Mangalyaan, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) astonished the world by launching 104 satellites in one rocket. Amazing, isn't it? The PSLV-C37 was sent into orbit on February 15th, 2017 at 9:28 a.m. from Satish Dhawan Space Centre SHAR, Sriharikota. This was PSLV's 39th mission and its weight was a massive 1378 kilograms! After a flight of 16 nerve-racking minutes, the rocket was in Earth's proximity.

Although the rocket was slightly out of orbit, India wasn't perturbed. ISRO professionally handled it, showing their ability to manoeuvre such an arduous expedition. In 12 minutes, all the 104 satellites separated from the rocket. These satellites were then used for geographical mapping, land information and other environmental purposes. Though there were many hardships faced along this journey, ISRO successfully completed its mission and attained such a marvelous feat!

Reading this made my heart fill up with glory and jubilation. I am extremely proud of our country and I am sure you are too! Likewise, I am confident; we will be resilient to hardships and incorporate such agile skills within us. Who knows maybe one day we will be the heart and soul of such expeditions.


